Presidents Report

At last - a normal year – or what will look normal for a few years yet. Masters Hockey managed to complete all our planned activities and continued the expansion we have seen over the last three years of the pandemic. That expansion and our participation rates come from hard work by our Committee and our team managers.

Our year started with a record first quarter Monday night competition and lead directly to a very successful Canberra Cup Carnival. The Canberra Cup continues to give a great carnival experience to players in Canberra and the Region. It is pleasing to see that the players nominating for this carnival are not the "same old dancing girls" and that we are attracting players from our Monday night competition. Even more pleasing is to see those players making themselves available for State and National teams.

Particular thanks to Scott Clingan for his work on the Cup and chasing sponsorship to ensure we give great hockey at a great price. First-round winners competed for the Canberra Cup, while first-round losers competed for the Canberra Plate. In a repeat of 2021, Macarthur took the Cup and Strawmen took the Plate.

Canberra players competed in NSW championships with our friends from Goulburn. Notably the Goulburn Over 65 side were declared "Raining Premiers" in the Division 2 competition in Wyong after rain caused the finals to be abandoned.

After a COVID Hiatus, the Association hosted *LifeNight*, an opportunity for members to relax, play some hockey and raise funds for local charity. A total of \$1500 was donated to three charities. On the hockey side, games were played over two weeks in April, with the "Keeper of the Flame" Jack Thompson Trophy awarded to the teams representing the Southside.

The year saw the return of the Australian Masters National Championships, held on the Gold Coast following three years of cancellations. While the ACT came away with no silverware, our participation rate and competitiveness again showed that we are a force in Australian Masters Hockey that punches well above our population weight. Thanks to hard work from Craig Johnston and his selection panel, team management and the committee the ACT put eight teams on the paddock: a team in every age group except the over 34s. With Masters World Cup selections on the line in 2023, I hope we might make that nine teams in Perth.

The second Intercity Challenge between Canberra and Sydney was also held. Aged-based teams from Canberra travelled to Sydney in November to compete for the *Merv Goodridge and Doug Dawson Cup*. After a full year of competition, and a home ground advantage, Sydney managed to win the trophy. Plans are underway for the ACT to host the Cup in November 2023.

Growth forced one big change in our administration in 2022 - the Association grew to the level requiring GST registration. Our budgets have pointed to us reaching the threshold since 2019, but the pandemic kept us under the line. My thanks to Warwick Bray for his work and persistence in getting the Association registered for GST, and for his work to make it all happen behind the scenes. For most of us, there will be no changes to the way things happen, thanks largely to the work Warwick puts in.

Finally, thank you to everybody that helps ACT Masters Hockey provide the opportunity to participate in the game we love. That includes Hockey ACT, our committee, our volunteers, but mostly our members who come out every week for the pleasure and good company.
