VALE PAUL HEMSLEY

After a long and often difficult battle with the ageing process, another of our founders has passed away.

Paul Hemsley was a passionate advocate for participation, and once he found hockey and the Veteran's ethos, he embraced both with gusto. Paul discovered our game late in life through his family and while not the most gifted player, his special skill was his love of playing and his fervour to make everybody else love it just as much.

Paul was a long-time member of our association. He played in 10 National Championships in 1985, 1993 to 1999, and then 2002 and 2005. He was team Manager in 1997 and 2002. In Canberra Paul played in our Monday night competition from 1985 to 2010. He also managed teams on Monday night from 2004 through to 2014.

And while I am still searching for proof, I am pretty sure that Paul was part of the ACT team that won the territory's first Hockey National Championship medal in 1985. I remember the radiant smile and glint in his eyes as Kakka hung that medal around his neck.

Paul will be remembered by all who came across him as a real gentleman. A bloke with a dry wit, a sharp mind and devotion to others. He called it noblesse oblige, a French term Paul often used and taught me. It refers to the unwritten obligation of people from noble ancestry to act honourably and generously to others. I am not sure Paul's nobility was listed in any book of

..... OR NEVER LET THE TRUTH GET IN THE WAY OF A GOOD STORY






WHAT HAS CHANGED



To PC or <u>NOT</u> to PC

Well, this must be the shortest trial of a hockey rule change since the Scottish banned kilts in Test Matches against the Irish. The FIH move lasted less than 3 weeks from announcement of the trial to having the CEO issue a ".... We're not scrapping it, just holding off on implementation for a bit". While opinions were mixed amongst early discussions it appeared likely a two-year trial would commence in Jan 24. Not to be, apparently.

Perhaps we could get FIH to get rid of the "accidental foot" infringement and help the game flow... or am I just dreaming again?



UNLIKE THE existing rule, where the attacking players can stand at the top of the 'D', as per the proposed rule they will have to stand beyond the 5m dotted line outside the circle.

The existing rule allows the attacking team to take a direct shot at goal from penalty corners after stopping the ball just outside the 'D'. Under the proposed rule, the ball has to travel 5m outside the circle before it is stopped by the players, who will be positioned at the dotted line.

The ball has to be played back inside the 'D' before a shot can be taken at goal.

Did you know that the Egyptians played an early form of hockey several thousand years ago. Aussie men and women serving in Cairo in WW1 and WW2 continued the links.




A social game in Cairo early in WW2
